LESSON Acts 7:54-60

Acts 7:54-60 When they heard this, they were furious and gnashed their teeth at him. But Stephen, full of the Holy Spirit, looked up to heaven and saw the glory of God, and Jesus standing at the right hand of God. "Look," he said, "I see heaven open and the Son of

Man standing at the right hand of God." At this they covered their ears and, yelling at the top of their voices, they all rushed at him, dragged him out of the city and began to stone him. Meanwhile, the witnesses laid their clothes at the feet of a young man named Saul. While

they were stoning him, Stephen prayed, "Lord Jesus, receive my spirit." Then he fell on his knees and cried out, "Lord, do not hold this sin against them." When he had said this, he fell asleep.

SERMON Hebrews 7:11-28

Hebrews 7:11 - 8:1 If perfection could have been attained through the Levitical priesthood (for on the basis of it the law was given to the people), why was there still need for another priest to come-- one in the order of Melchizedek, not in the order of Aaron? For when there is a change of the priesthood, there must also be a change of the law. He of whom these things are said belonged to a different tribe, and no one from that tribe has ever served at the altar. For it is clear that our Lord descended from Judah, and in regard to that tribe Moses said nothing about priests. And what we have said is even more clear if another priest like Melchizedek appears, one who has become a priest

not on the basis of a regulation as to his ancestry but on the basis of the power of an indestructible life. For it is declared: "You are a priest forever, in the order of Melchizedek." The former regulation is set aside because it was weak and useless (for the law made nothing perfect), and a better hope is introduced, by which we draw near to God. And it was not without an oath! Others became priests without any oath, but he became a priest with an oath when God said to him: "The Lord has sworn and will not change his mind: 'You are a priest forever." Because of this oath, Iesus has become the guarantee of a better covenant. Now there have been many of those priests, since death prevented

them from continuing in office; but because Jesus lives forever, he has a permanent priesthood. Therefore he is able to save completely those who come to God through him, because he always lives to intercede for them. Such a high priest meets our need-- one who is holy, blameless, pure, set apart from sinners, exalted above the heavens. Unlike the other high priests, he does not need to offer sacrifices day after day, first for his own sins, and then for the sins of the people. He sacrificed for their sins once for all when he offered himself. For the law appoints as high priests men who are weak; but the oath, which came after the law, appointed the Son, who has been made perfect forever.

About the Cover ~ The drawing on the cover depicts Abraham returning victoriously from the Battle of the Kings, noted in Genesis 14. As he entered the Valley of Shaveh, he was met by an extraordinary individual named Melchizedek. This mysterious man's name means, "King of Righteousness." He was also called the King of Salem, which means, "King of Peace"; therefore he was a king. But he was also referred to as "priest of God Most High," even before the priesthood had been established under Moses. On top of everything else, he blessed Abraham, and Abraham gave Melchizedek one tenth of the plunder he had taken in the battle. Thus Abraham was honoring Melchizedek as someone greater than himself. Later, the psalmist would reveal that one would come who would be a high priest in the order of Melchizedek -- just as mysterious, and greater than Abraham and all the prophets. The writer of the book of Hebrews reveals this new high priest as Jesus Christ, the one prefigured by Melchizedek as a priest unlike those before him, but greater in power, righteousness, and longevity. This High Priest lives forever to intercede for us, and has saved us from our sin.
