

About the Cover ~ Depicted on the cover is the prophet Jeremiah and the vision he received from the LORD in chapter 1, verses 11-17. The prophet saw an almond branch (top right). The word for an almond is the same word in Hebrew as the word for "watch." The almond branch was a symbol that the LORD was watching the people of Judah. Sadly he watched them offer sacrifices and incense to false gods, as also portrayed in the drawing (bottom right). Therefore God also gave Jeremiah a vision of a boiling pot tipping from the north (top left) which was the stern warning that Babylonians were coming to conquer the people of Judah (bottom left). Although it was a painful message to deliver, Jeremiah faithfully reported it to his people as God commanded him to do. Sadly, his preaching was met with violent opposition. Regardless, Jeremiah held fast to the truth, and in the end was blessed by God for doing so.
