#### FIRST LESSON

With the coming of dawn, the

angels urged Lot, saying,
"Hurry! Take your wife and
your two daughters who are
here, or you will be swept away
when the city is punished."
When he hesitated, the men
grasped his hand and the hands
of his wife and of his two
daughters and led them safely

out of the city, for the LORD was merciful to them. As soon as they had brought them out, one of them said, "Flee for your lives! Don't look back, and don't stop anywhere in the plain! Flee to the mountains or you will be swept away!"

By the time Lot reached Zoar,

#### Genesis 19:15-17, 23-29

the sun had risen over the land. Then the LORD rained down burning sulfur on Sodom and Gomorrah-- from the LORD out of the heavens. Thus he overthrew those cities and the entire plain, including all those living in the cities-- and also the vegetation in the land. But Lot's wife looked back, and she

became a pillar of salt. Early the next morning Abraham got up and returned to the place where he had stood before the LORD. He looked down toward Sodom and Gomorrah, toward all the land of the plain, and he saw dense smoke rising from the land, like smoke from a furnace. So when God destroyed the cities of the plain, he remembered Abraham, and he brought Lot out of the catastrophe that overthrew the cities where Lot had lived.
