Revelation 3:14-22

"To the angel of the church in Laodicea write: These are the words of the Amen, the faithful and true witness, the ruler of God's creation. I know your deeds, that you are neither cold nor hot. I wish you were either one or the other! So, because you are lukewarm-- neither hot nor cold-- I am about to spit you out of my mouth. You say, 'I am rich; I have acquired wealth and

do not need a thing.' But you do not realize that you are wretched, anyone hears my voice and pitiful, poor, blind and naked. I counsel you to buy from me gold refined in the fire, so you can become rich; and white clothes to wear, so you can cover on my throne, just as I overcame your shameful nakedness; and salve to put on your eyes, so you can see. About the Cover ~ This very popular painting is one that most of you are no doubt familiar with. It is entitled, "Christ at Heart's Door," and was painted by American artist Warner Sallman (1892-1968), who is also famous for his paintings of "Jesus in Gethsemane," and the "Head of Christ" which has sold over 400 million copies. The theme of "Christ at Heart's Door" is taken from our sermon text for today. It is a reminder that our Lord Jesus Christ seeks to have fellowship with us, and comes to us through the gospel message of his love and forgiveness. He beckons to us to "open the door," that is, to believe and receive by faith all that he promises through his perfect life and innocent death in our place. In the words of Psalm 95:7-8: "Today, if you hear his voice, do not harden your hearts." Jesus is ever knocking and seeks to come in and take up his permanent residence in our hearts so that he rules over everything we do. May his kingdom come and his name be hallowed among us.
