About the Cover ~ After Judas Iscariot betrayed Jesus and hanged himself out of guilt and unbelief, the Twelve Apostles deduced from the Scriptures that someone had to be appointed to fill the position he vacated. St. Matthias was chosen to replace him. It is the first call meeting ever recorded in the New Testament. Although not much is known about Matthias beyond this brief section from the book of Acts, church tradition holds that he worked in Judea or Ethiopia. He is said to have been stoned and then beheaded by means of a type of sword known as a scimitar which is depicted in his symbol over the top of a Bible, which reminds us of his martyrdom and ministry as a preacher of the gospel of Jesus Christ our Savior.
