Responses in the Rite of Confirmation

My dear young friends, when you were younger you received the gift of saving faith and became members of God's family through Holy Baptism. From that time on your parents and church have provided you with many opportunities to learn more fully from the Word of God the meaning of that precious faith and of your position and high calling in God's family. Now you are gathered here before God and this Christian congregation to promise your faithfulness to the Triune God and to dedicate yourselves to Him for this life and for eternity. In the name of the Lord and on behalf of this congregation I invite you to lift up your hearts to the God of all grace and cheerfully to answer the questions I shall now ask you:

Are you ready and willing, in the presence of God and of this Christian congregation, to promise your faithfulness to the Triune God?

I am.

Do you believe in God the Father?

Yes, I believe in God the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth.

Do you believe in Jesus Christ, God's Son?

Yes, I believe in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried. He descended into hell; the third day He rose again from the dead; He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty; from there He will come to Judge the living and the dead.

Do you believe in the Holy Spirit?

Yes, I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Holy Christian Church, the Communion of Saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body and the life everlasting.

Do you believe that all the accepted books of the Bible are truly the inspired and inerrant Word of God, and that the teachings of the Bible as they are confessed and taught by the Evangelical Lutheran Church, and as you have learned to know them, are true and correct?

I do

Do you intend to continue faithfully in the teachings of the Word of God and of the Evangelical Lutheran Church and suffer anything, even death, rather than fall away from them?

I do so intend, with the help of God.

Do you also intend to live your whole life according to the Word of God, to be diligent in the use of the means of grace, to think, speak and act as is fitting for one who believes the gospel of Christ, and to remain true to the Triune God until you die?

I do so intend, by the grace of God.

Come, then, to the Lord's altar as a symbol of your promise, and then kneel to receive His blessing.

Exhortation Addressed to the Parents

Following the blessing of the confirmands the Pastor shall ask the parents to rise and shall then say:

When you brought these children to be baptized, you realized that you were following the will of your Lord Jesus, who said, "Let the little children come to me." At the same time you understood

that your responsibilities had not ended at their baptisms. You knew that the Scriptures also commanded you to "bring up your children in the training and instruction of the Lord." This you have done in your homes and by using the assistance that has been offered by your fellow Christians in this congregation. However, our Lord Jesus wants you to remember that your duties to these children are not completed at their confirmation, either. Rather, they continue until your role as their parents is ended by death.

Therefore I exhort and ask you in the name of our Lord Jesus:

Will you continue to lead these children to appreciate the Word of God, to invite them to accompany you to the Lord's Supper often, and to encourage them to make daily use of their Bibles in their homes? Will you by your words, and especially by your examples, impress upon them the necessity of hearing the Word of the Lord which is that one thing needful, and which cannot be taken away from them? And finally, in all things will you continue to point them to their priceless Treasure, their Lord Jesus Christ, who has promised them and you a crown of righteousness in heaven? If so, then answer, YES, WITH THE HELP OF GOD.

PARENTS: "YES, WITH THE HELP OF GOD."

May the Lord grant you the strength to carry out your intentions in his name. Amen.
